Language(s) of Instruction	Subjects offered to exchange students are taught in English
Language Proficiency	The Hague University of Applied Sciences does not require a language test but relies on its partner institutions to evaluate their student's English proficiency and make sure that the level is sufficient to cope with the study programme. A specific minimum level of English may be specified in the exchange agreement between your home institution and THUAS.
Grading system	Each module or subject taught at The Hague University of Applied Sciences is worth a number of ECTS. One ECTS credit represents 28 hours of full-time study. The Dutch grading scale consists of numbers running from 1 to 10, where 1 is the lowest grade, 10 the highest and 5,5 the lowest passing grade.
