| Visa Information | International students from countries that may enter Argentina as tourists without |
| | a visa are not required to get a student visa before arrival in Argentina. Instead, |
| | they must process their temporary residence within 90 days of their first entry to |
| | Argentina. |
| | Students from the United States, Canada and Australia must pay a reciprocity fee |
| | before arriving to Buenos Aires (and do not require a pre-entry visa). |
| | Students from countries that require a visa must obtain this document before |
