Robert M. McDowell is a partner at Cooley LLP and is co-leader of its global communications practice group, where he advises telecommunications, media and technology clients on their most significant regulatory, legal and business matters. As a former commissioner of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), Commissioner McDowell has been at the forefront of the most complex and groundbreaking issues facing telecommunications. He was first appointed to the FCC by President George W. Bush in 2006 and again by President Obama in 2009. He was unanimously confirmed both times by the U.S. Senate. The Commissioner also served on the U.S. delegation to the 2012 World Conference on International Telecommunications.
