Dr. Tina Lee is an applied anthropologist who studies public policy and inequality in the United States. She earned a PhD in Anthropology from the City University of New York Graduate Center in 2010. She has conducted research about the child welfare (family policing) system in both New York City and rural Wisconsin as well as research about environmental governance and humanitarian engineering. She is the author of *Catching a Case: Inequality and Fear in New York City's Child Welfare System* (published by Rutgers University Press in 2016) as well as articles based on her fieldwork in the NYC child welfare system. A chapter about her work in Wisconsin, "*They Think They Can Punish You Into Getting Sober: Poverty, Drug 'Crises,' and the Foster Care System,*" will be published in the volume entitled *Policing or Providing?* edited by Jennifer Randles and Kerry Woodward published by New York University Press.
