Southwestern Law School's Biederman Institute is a leading academic center for the study of entertainment, media, the arts, and sports law. The Institute trains students to become excellent and creative lawyers through rigorous and unique courses, programs, externships, clinical experiences, and other opportunities. Working with a law student population that is more than fifty percent racially and ethnically diverse, the Institute is a pipeline to diversify the legal profession and entertainment industry. The Institute actively seeks opportunities to advance social justice. Institute professors publish in leading journals, write books, and present at conferences around the world.

Entertainment Programming

The Institute sponsors a summer study-abroad program in London, supports a cohort of student scholars, and co-sponsors an internationally recognized entertainment and media law conference. Southwestern also provides an opportunity for practitioners to audit courses including copyright, television production, and trademark law. Student organizations, including the Entertainment Law Society, also provide programming throughout the year from a recent grads panel to how to succeed in the industry.

Each year, the Institute selected several outstanding students to serve as Biderman Scholars. Professor Kevin J. Greene, John J. Schumacher Chair, was the subject of a Rolling Stone profile in March 2022. Professor Greene is a nationally recognized entertainment and intellectual property law scholar and an expert witness consultant for copyright, trademark, publicity rights, and entertainment contract disputes.

Entertainment & the Arts Clinic

Through the Entertainment & the Arts Clinic, the Institute serves and advocates for talent, writers, composers, producers, directors, rights-holders, and others who seek legal assistance with their creative projects and affords students unique, hands-on opportunities to develop critical lawyering skills. The Clinic serves 20–25 clients each semester and has handled more than 200 matters since its 2012 inception. Most recently, clinic students helped prepare a documentary about the friendship between the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu, Mission: Joy Finding Happiness in Troubled Times, for broadcast. The students' names appear in the end credits.
