Anti-Hazing Policy

Southwestern Law School is committed to fostering a professional, respectful, safe, and inclusive educational environment for all students, free from hazing. Hazing, in any form, is incompatible with our values and professional expectations and is strictly prohibited. This policy applies to all students, student organizations, honors programs, journals, clinics, and any other student groups affiliated with Southwestern. This policy complies with the federal Stop Campus Hazing Act and California state law.

Reportable Violations

Pursuant to the California Stop Campus Hazing Act (CA Education Code 66309), there were no reportable violations of the law school's Anti-Hazing policy from July 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025.

How to Report Violations

All faculty, staff, and student leaders must report known or suspected hazing within 24 hours of learning of the alleged conduct to the Student Services Office or Campus Security. Students are encouraged to report suspected hazing incidents to the same offices. Reports will be handled promptly, with respect for confidentiality and protection against retaliation. Reports can be made anonymously by calling 213-738-5730 or by submitting an anonymously written report to the Student Services Office or Campus Security. Individuals may also choose to report hazing directly to local law enforcement at any time, and Southwestern will cooperate with any criminal investigation.
