



Student Lived First Name and Pronouns Form

Under the Student Lived First Name and Pronouns Policy (Policy), students may use a lived first name and their legal name. A student's lived first name is the name a student wishes to be known by in the Southwestern community. A student's legal name is the name that appears on the student's passport, driver's license, birth certificate, or U.S. Social Security Card. The student's lived first name may be used in many contexts, including seating charts, Quickly Attendance, Canvas, Self Service, and ID cards. For some records, Southwestern will use a student's legal name for legal or business requirements. Whenever reasonably possible, Southwestern will use a student's lived first name. Students may also update their pronouns via this form. Due to limitations described in the Policy, Southwestern cannot guarantee that the updated information will consistently appear across all platforms and documents.
