How to Critique (Technology Law), NORTHWESTERN JOURNAL OF TECHNOLOGY AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY (forthcoming 2027)

This article argues for re-introducing deconstructive methods into legal analysis, offering a novel method for deconstructing laws that govern emerging technologies, using insights from critical theory and interdisciplinary concepts borrowed from sociology, philosophy, media studies, science and technology studies, and more. This article makes two contributions to the field: First, this article proposes a theoretical method deconstructing (technology) law. This method can be useful for scholars and students. Second, this article applies the method to deconstruct U.S. administrative regulations on AI, shedding light on the growing body of what one may call U.S. AI law.

This article surveys the current status of state constitutional rights to privacy, focusing on the eleven states in which a right to privacy is expressly enshrined in the text of the state constitution. The article compares these rights and how each state has developed its jurisprudence surrounding the right, to offer insights into how the right to privacy may continue to develop on a state level in the future.

In this article (presented at the Yale Law School Propaganda and Emerging Technologies Conference 2024), I trace the history of propaganda through eras of communication media, revealing that the salient factor missing in contemporary propaganda regulation is *personalization*—especially personalization driven by Big Data, the Internet, and AI. I argue that, instead of attempting to govern through speech regulation (which will rarely pass First Amendment scrutiny), lawmakers should regulate propaganda by focusing on privacy and data protection laws that attack the personalization factor.

Ending the AI Race: Regulatory Collaboration as Critical Counter-Narrative, VILLANOVA LAW REVIEW (2025).

This article utilizes interdisciplinary, sociolegal methods to deconstruct zero-sum narratives of AI competition and proposes a new framework of *regulatory collaboration* for international multistakeholder policymaking, arguing that traditional models of regulatory competition and regulatory co-epitition unfairly discriminate against already marginalized populations and reinforce hierarchies of global inequity.
